Statewide Raised Pavement Marker Installation

Tier 1 Categorical Exclusion

The purpose of these projects is to install raised pavement markers on the entire Arkansas state highway system to improve visibility and safety. The proposed installation would occur solely on existing highway surfaces.

These projects would not involve relocations or impacts to important farmlands, wetlands, underground storage tanks, hazardous materials, any environmental justice issues, or cultural resources. These projects have been determined to generate minimal air quality impacts for Clean Air Act criteria pollutants and have not been linked with any special mobile source air toxics concerns. The cultural resources clearance is attached.

The official species lists obtained through the US Fish and Wildlife Service's Information for Planning and Consultation identified the following species as potentially occurring within the project areas: Gray Bat (Myotis grisescens), Indiana Bat (Myotis sodalis), Northern Long-eared Bat (Myotis septentrionalis), Ozark Big-eared Bat (Corynorhinus townsendii ingens), Tricolored Bat (Perimyotis subflavus), Eastern Black Rail (Laterallus jamaicensis ssp. jamaicensis), Ivory-billed Woodpecker (Campephilus principalis), Piping Plover (Charadrius melodus), Red Knot (Calidris canutus rufa), Red-cockaded Woodpecker (Picoides borealis), Whooping Crane (Grus americana), Alligator Snapping Turtle (Macrochelys temminckii), Leopard Darter (Percina pantherina), Ozark Cavefish (Amblyopsis rosae), Ozark Hellbender (Cryptobranchus alleganiensis bishopi), Pallid Sturgeon (Scaphirhynchus albus), Arkansas Fatmucket (Lampsilis powellii), Curtis Pearlymussel (Epioblasma curtisii), Fat Pocketbook (Potamilus capax), Lousiana Pearlshell (Margaritifera hembeli), Neosho Mucket (Lampsilis rafinesqueana), Ouachita Rock Pocketbook (Arcidens wheeleri), Pink Mucket (Lampsilis abrupta), Rabbitsfoot (Theliderma cylindrica), Scaleshell (Potamilus leptodon), Snuffbox (Epioblasma triquetra), Speckled Pocketbook (Lampsilis streckeri), Spectaclecase (Cumberlandia monodonta), Winged Mapleleaf (Quadrula fragosa), American Burying Beetle (Nicrophorus americana), Benton County Cave Crayfish (Cambarus aculabrum), Missouri bladderpod (Physaria filiformis), harperella (Ptilimnium nodosum), pondberry (Lindera melissifolia), geocarpon (Geocarpon minimum), and Monarch Butterfly (Danaus plexippus). The official species lists are attached. These projects will have "no effect" on

the aforementioned species due to the limited scope of the action, lack of suitable habitat, and distance to known species locations.

The Alligator Snapping Turtle is currently a proposed threatened species; the Tricolored Bat is a proposed endangered species, and the Monarch Butterfly is a candidate species; however, the proposed projects would not jeopardize the continued existence of these species.

These projects would not have a discharge of dredged or fill material into waters of the United States; therefore, a Section 404 permit will not be required.

After appropriate environmental review, it has been determined that the subject jobs are a Tier 1 Categorical Exclusion as described by the ARDOT/FHWA Programmatic Agreement on Categorical Exclusion Documentation and Processing. A public hearing will not be offered for the projects.

The Arkansas Department of Transportation proposes the installation of raised pavement safety markers along portions of the Arkansas Primary Highway Network, statewide. No new right-of-way will be acquired. All work will occur within the existing roadways.

The proposed safety markers will be installed on the existing pavement surfaces and the extremely limited scope of the project does not have the potential to affect any undisturbed land surfaces or historic properties. Therefore, this project requires no Section 106 review under Appendix B, Activity A, of the 2021 Programmatic Agreement.
