The Environmental Division reviewed the referenced project and has determined it falls within the definition of the Tier 3 Categorical Exclusion as defined by the ARDOT/FHWA Programmatic Agreement on the processing of Categorical Exclusions. The following information is included for your review and, if acceptable, approval as the environmental documentation for this project.

The purpose of this project is to replace Bridge #02240 over Prairie Creek on Highway 71 in Sebastian County. Total length of the project is less than one mile. A project location map is attached.

The existing roadway consists of two 12' wide paved travel lanes with 6' wide paved shoulders. The existing bridge is 110' x 32' and in poor condition. A relief box culvert will also be replaced.

The new bridge and box culvert will have improved approaches with two 12' wide paved travel lanes with 8' (6' paved) wide shoulders. Up to 6.0 acres of additional right of way will be required for this project. Of this additional acreage, up to 1.9 acres will be prime farmland and 0.3 acre will be Farmland of Statewide Importance. A NRCS-CPA-106 Form is attached.

There are no relocations, environmental justice issues, wellhead protection area/public water supplies, or cultural resources associated with this project. Field inspections found no evidence of existing underground storage tanks or hazardous waste deposits. A public involvement will not be held for this project.

Based on the ARDOT noise policy, a noise analysis is not required for this project. The bridge replacement will not involve adding capacity, substantially changing the roadway alignment, or exposing noise sensitive land uses to traffic noise sources. In compliance with federal guidelines, local authorities will not require notification.

This project has been determined to generate minimal air quality impacts for Clean Air Act criteria pollutants and has not been linked with any special mobile source

air toxic (MSAT) concerns. As such, this project will not result in changes in traffic volumes, vehicle mix, basic project location, or any other factor that would cause a meaningful increase in MSAT impacts of the project from that of the no-build alternative.

Sebastian County participates in the National Flood Insurance Program. The project lies within the Zone A, Special Flood Hazard Area. The final project design will be reviewed to confirm that the design is adequate and that the potential risk to life and property are minimized. Adjacent properties should not be impacted nor have a greater flood risk than existed before construction of the project. None of the encroachments will constitute a substantial floodplain encroachment or risk to property or life.

The official species list obtained through the US Fish and Wildlife Service's (USFWS) Information for Planning and Consultation website lists the northern long-eared bat (*Myotis septentrionalis*), Piping Plover (*Charadrius melodus*), Eastern Black Rail (*Laterallus jamaicensis*), Red Knot (*Calidris canutus rufa*), American burying beetle (*Nicrophorus americanus*), rattlesnake-master borer moth (*Papaipema eryngii*), and Geocarpon (*Geocarpon minimum*) as protected species potentially occurring in the project area. See the official species list.

Based on the lack of habitat, scope of the project, and distance to known species, it has been determined that the proposed project will have "no effect" on the Piping Plover, Eastern Black Rail, Red Knot, rattlesnake-master borer moth, and *Geocarpon minimum*.


Based on limited habitat being affected along the existing roadway, bridge, and right of way; distance to known species locations, and implementation of best management practices, it has been determined that the proposed project "may affect, but is not likely to adversely affect" the American burying beetle. The USFWS concurred on January 31, 2020.

The Final 4(d) Rule applies to the project's activities that have the potential to affect northern long-eared bats. The Final 4(d) Rule exempts the incidental take of northern long-eared bats from take prohibitions in the Endangered Species Act. The exemptions apply as long as the activities do not occur within 0.25 mile of a known hibernaculum or within 150' of a known occupied maternity roost from June 1 to July 31. No known hibernacula or maternity roosts exist within the project limits; therefore, the project can proceed without restrictions. All offsite locations will require coordination with USFWS. Please see the attached Verification Letter.

Impacts to waters of the United States are estimated to be less than 0.1 acre. Construction should be allowed under the terms of a Nationwide Permit 14 for Linear Transportation Projects as defined in the Federal Register 82 (4):1860 – 2008. No pre-construction notification will be required.

No other adverse environmental impacts were identified. The checklist used to verify consideration of potential environmental impacts is attached.



The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) is responding to your request dated January 28, 2020 to verify that the proposed Arkansas Department of Transportation (ArDOT) Job Number 040781 Prairie Creek Str. & Apprs., Sebastian County, Arkansas (Project) may rely on the February 5, 2018, Programmatic Biological Opinion (BO) for federally funded or approved transportation projects that may affect the federally listed endangered Indiana Bat (Myotis sodalis) and/or federally listed threatened Northern Long-eared Bat (NLEB) (Myotis septentrionalis).

The project was described and assessed as follows (abbreviated):

The IPaC generated species list determined that the Northern Long-eared Bat, Eastern Black Rail, Piping Plover, Red Knot, American Burying Beetle, rattlesnake-master borer moth, and *Geocarpon minimum* could be present within the limits of the proposed project. Based on the lack of habitat, distance to known species, and scope of the project, it is our determination that the proposed project will have no effect on the Eastern Black Rail, Piping Plover, Red Knot, Rattlesnake-master Borer Moth, and *Geocarpon minimum*. Based on the distance to known species, limited impact acreage, and scope of the project, it is our determination that the proposed project may affect, but is not likely to adversely affect the American Burying Beetle. Based on the IPaC determination key and the use of the 4 (d) rule it was determined that the proposed project may affect, but is not likely to adversely affect the Northern Long-eared Bat.

The Service received your concurrence verification letter and request to verify that the Proposed Action may rely on the concurrence provided in the revised February 5, 2018, Federal Highway Administrationi (FHWA), Federal Railroad Administration (FRA), Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Programmatic Biological Opinion for Transportation Projects within the Range of the Indiana Bat and Northern Long-eared Bat (PBO) to satisfy requirements under Section 7(a)(2) of the Endangered Species Act of 1973 (ESA) (87 Stat. 884, as amended; 16 U.S.C 1531 et seq.).



Based on the information ArDOT provided, ArDOT determined the Proposed Action is within the scope and adheres to the criteria of the PBO, including the adoption of applicable avoidance and minimization measures, may affect, but is not likely to adversely affect (NLAA) Indiana Bat and Northern Long-eared Bat. The Service concurs that this action may rely on the PBO.

Please keep in mind that ArDOT must report any departures from the plans submitted; results of any surveys conducted; or any dead, injured, or sick listed bats to this office. If this project is not completed within one year of this letter, you must update your determination and resubmit the required information.

Furthermore, due to the limited habitat being affected along existing roadway, bridge, and right of way, negative listed bat bridge assessment, the distance to known species locations or hibernacula, the implementation of best management practices, inactive season clearing, and the standard provisions for stream sediment control and water quality conservation measures, the Service concurs with ArDOT's determination of may affect, not likely to adversely affect for the American Burying Beetle and agrees with your assessment for all other identified listed species. This concurrence concludes your ESA Section 7 responsibilities relative to these species for this action.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) received on February 05, 2020 your effects determination for the 'Prairie Creek Str. & Apprs.' (the Action) using the northern long-eared bat (*Myotis septentrionalis*) key within the Information for Planning and Consultation (IPaC) system. This IPaC key assists users in determining whether a Federal action is consistent with the activities analyzed in the Service's January 5, 2016, Programmatic Biological Opinion (PBO). The PBO addresses activities excepted from "take" prohibitions applicable to the northern long-eared bat under the Endangered Species Act of 1973 (ESA) (87 Stat.884, as amended; 16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.).

Based upon your IPaC submission, the Action is consistent with activities analyzed in the PBO. The Action may affect the northern long-eared bat; however, any take that may occur as a result of the Action is not prohibited under the ESA Section 4(d) rule adopted for this species at 50 CFR §17.40(o). Unless the Service advises you within 30 days of the date of this letter that your IPaC-assisted determination was incorrect, this letter verifies that the PBO satisfies and concludes your responsibilities for this Action under ESA Section 7(a)(2) with respect to the northern long-eared bat.

Please report to our office any changes to the information about the Action that you submitted in IPaC, the results of any bat surveys conducted in the Action area, and any dead, injured, or sick northern long-eared bats that are found during Action implementation. If the Action is not completed within one year of the date of this letter, you must update and resubmit the information required in the IPaC key.

This IPaC-assisted determination allows you to rely on the PBO for compliance with ESA Section 7(a)(2) <u>only</u> for the northern long-eared bat. It **does not** apply to the following ESA-protected species that also may occur in the Action area:


