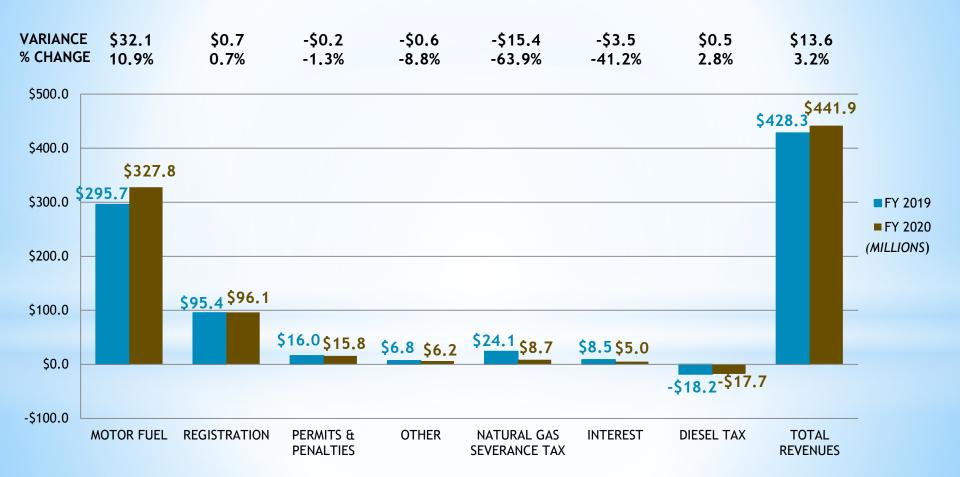
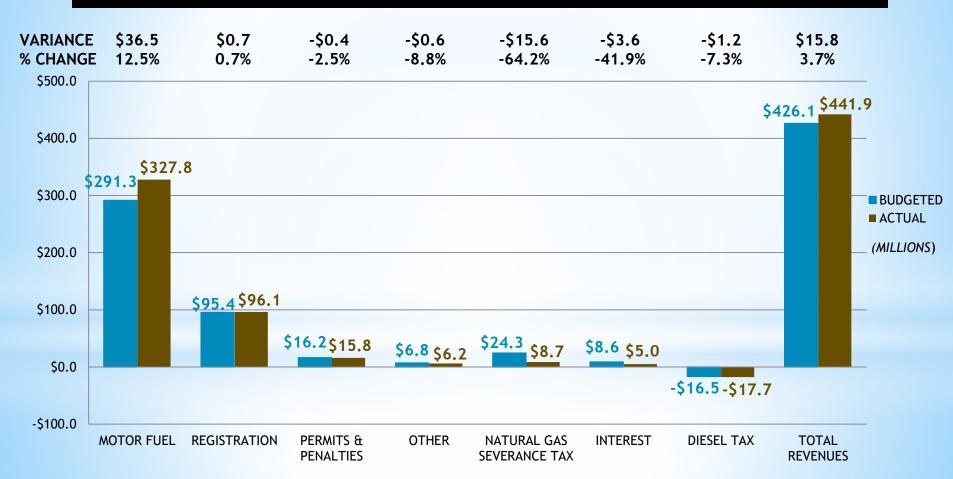


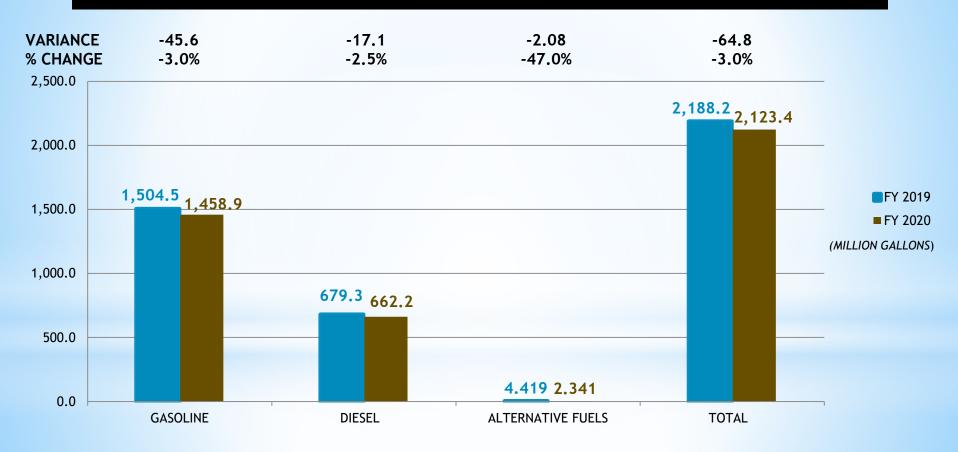
FY 2019-2020 REVENUE
