IT IS ORDERED that a meeting of the Arkansas State Highway Commission be opened at 10:00 a.m., June 16, 2021.

WHEREAS, the Purchasing Committee has awarded purchases on May 7, May 10, May 19, May 24, and June 4, 2021 in the amounts of \$3,925,994.97, \$138,600.00, \$101,637.50, \$244,273.00, and \$655,489.64, respectively totaling \$5,065,995.11, and supply and service contracts, in accordance with authority previously conveyed, all of which have been documented by official minutes which are of record in the files of the Commission and Equipment and Procurement Division.

WHEREAS, in accordance with Amendment 42 of the Arkansas Constitution, Section 6, as well as other laws of this State, the Commission has the authority to delegate certain powers to the Director of Highways and Transportation.

NOW THEREFORE, upon the contractors furnishing the necessary performance and payment bonds and submitting all additional information required for the above mentioned projects, the Director is hereby authorized to enter into contracts and supplemental agreements for any projects deemed to be in the best interests of the State.

FURTHERMORE, the Director is authorized to reject any or all proposals, to waive technicalities, and/or to advertise for new proposals whenever deemed to be in the best interests of the State.

Chairman Moore opened the meeting by welcoming those in attendance in-person, as well as those who were watching online.

The Commission approved Minute Order 2020-104 on December 9, 2020, authorizing the Department to enter into any necessary contracts and agreements with consulting firms to provide underwater bridge inspection services. Commissioner Keith Gibson moved, Commissioner Marie Holder seconded and the motion passed to accept the Staff's recommendation to enter into negotiations with the following firm:

MOTION Commissioner Philip Taldo moved, Vice Chairman Alec Farmer seconded and the motion passed to approve the State Fiscal Year 2022 Operating Budget (July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022), as presented by Chief Fiscal Officer, Patrick Patton, which included the following:

Salary Highlights

- \$5.5 million (3%) for Achieving Career Excellence (ACE) pay increases
- Increase in number of positions to help the Department meet operational needs

Operation Highlights

- 1% increase to District Maintenance Budget
- \$2 million increase to Heavy Bridge Maintenance budget
- \$4 million increase to Roadway Equipment budget
- \$3.3 million for Department match for State group insurance rate

MOTION Vice Chairman Alec Farmer moved, Commissioner Philip Taldo seconded and the motion passed to enter into Executive Session at 11:43 a.m. to conduct an annual review of Director Lorie Tudor's employment.

MOTION Vice Chairman Alec Farmer moved, Commissioner Philip Taldo seconded and the motion passed to close Executive Session and reopen the public meeting at 1:02 p.m. Chairman Robert Moore made brief remarks that the Commission was highly satisfied with Director Tudor's performance. No formal action was taken.

OTHER DISCUSSION ITEMS

Patrick Patton, Chief Fiscal Officer, provided the May 2021 update on State Highway Revenue. Mr. Patton noted that State Highway Revenues to the Department from traditional sources are up a total of 1.5% (\$5.5 million) in the State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2021 compared to SFY 2020. Revenue from the Natural Gas Severance Tax is higher this year compared to last year. Total revenues available are 0.9% (\$3.3 million) above last year. Actual State Revenue received is 6.6% (\$24.1 million) above projected (budgeted) revenue for this year. Mr. Patton stated that May revenue from the 0.5% General Sales Tax for the Connecting Arkansas Program was 31.28% higher, (\$5,213,905) than projected by the Department of Finance and Administration (DF&A) for the month. Year to date actual revenue is above projections by 13.50% (\$25,081,560). Since inception, this revenue source is 1.49%, or \$21.5 million, above DF&A's projections.

Kevin Thornton, Assistant Chief of Administration, updated the Commission on the status of Federal Highway and Transit funding issues. Since the May 5 meeting, five additional funding plans have been presented for consideration. All of the plans presented range from five to eight years in length and each of them will increase funding above the current FAST Act levels, which expires on September 30, 2021. Each of the plans will produce significant benefits to Arkansas and those who travel our highways. Department Staff will continue to monitor how Washington addresses this issue.

Rex Vines, Deputy Director and Chief Engineer, and Steve Frisbee, Assistant Chief Engineer for Operations, provided an update to the repairs on the I-40 Mississippi River Bridge. Additionally, Mr. Vines provided an extensive overview of the Department's Bridge Inspection Program. Mr. Frisbee updated the Commission on current traffic patterns in the West Memphis area, and highlighted the changes that were implemented to improve traffic flow and reduce delays.

Director Tudor presented a list of upcoming meetings and events that the Director will be attending.

In closing, Director Tudor recognized Vice Chairman Alec Farmer's recent appointment to serve on the Arkansas Blue Cross and Blue Shield Board of Directors. Director Tudor also notified the Commission of two awards that the Department recently received. ARDOT's newly redesigned website received the 2021 Communicator Awards "Award of Distinction" and the 2021 Hermes Creative Awards "Honorable Mention"
