## HEALTH INSURANCE OPEN ENROLLMENT

It is the time of year to start planning for Open Enrollment. Open Enrollment for the 2023 health insurance plan year will be from October 1 - 31, 2022.

Employees are able to make the following changes during open enrollment:

• Enroll into the plan

- Add/drop spouse and/or dependents
- Change plan level
- Cancel coverage

Members who do not elect any changes during open enrollment will keep their current coverage for the 2023 plan year. Changes made during enrollment go into effect January 1, 2023.

Information on rates and plan changes will be made available via email as soon as they are published for the 2023 plan year. ◆

All forms should be submitted to your District Office or directly back to the Group Insurance Office in the Central Office, Room 204.

#### SUPPLEMENTAL BENEFITS:

The supplemental benefits (Dental, Vision, Life, Aflac, etc.) enrollment will be from September 1 – October 31, 2022. Remember this is the only time of the year to make changes, cancel or add these benefits. Please make time to review your benefits and make any changes necessary before October 31, 2022.

ARDOT has announced the recipients of this year's \$500 scholarships from the Southern Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (SASHTO).

## **ARDOT LENDS A HAND WITH TORNADO DEBRIS CLEANUP**

On December 10, 2021, northeast Arkansas got hit by multiple storms and tornadoes. The weather system traveled straight across District 10 taking out a nursing home in Manila and a Dollar General store in Leachville. As the system continued eastward, it set a record for distance on the ground by a tornado and severely impacted communities as far east as Mayfield, Kentucky.

In the aftermath, the city of Trumann was left with widespread damage and a great deal of debris. Officials quickly designated a location in town that would temporarily receive debris, which in some locations across the community measured six to eight feet deep. As debris accumulated, the next challenge was to determine what to do with it once collected. Trumann Mayor Barbara Lewallen approached Governor Hutchinson and a removal plan was put into place that involved the Arkansas Division of Emergency Management, the Arkansas Forestry Commission, the Department of Corrections, the Arkansas Division of Environmental Quality and ARDOT.

"Districts One, Five and Ten have coordinated the hauling of debris to a landfill near Amagon in Jackson County," District Ten Engineer Brad Smithee shared. "To date, we have hauled over 500 truck loads out and are still going strong!

"We began on June 24, skipped Juneteenth because the landfill was closed, but have hauled each day since then. Our staff has essentially assembled volunteers for the Friday work because

that is the best day for truck availability since these are days off during the four-day work schedule. Using today as an example, we have approximately 32 trucks making rounds plus additional staff on the ground providing direction. Some 35-plus great souls volunteered to work on this 100-degree day!"

Trucks start loading at 7:00 each morning and run until 5:00 in the afternoon. Without a doubt, each state agency involved has done their share to get the job done!  $\diamond$


