This is a follow up to our correspondence related to the requested left turn lane on highway 8 East at the entrance of the new Centerpoint K-5 campus.

Since our last communication I have reexamined the project budget and adjusted the district's operating funds in such a way that I am now in a position to propose to the Centerpoint Board of Education that we amend the budget to include expenditures up to \$50,000 toward the construction of the proposed turning lane.

I understand that funding is tight for all public service agencies- including funds for highways and schools. It is my hope that this commitment and contribution of the district toward this important state highway safety project demonstrates our desire to partner with the state highway department to help make the roads in our area safer for the apx 1,000 children, 140 staff members, and the countless parents and patrons of our district who will navigate this section of road each day.

In this spirit, I am again requesting that the Arkansas State Highway Department partner with the Centerpoint School District in planning, approval, and construction of the left turning lane to our new K-5 Elementary campus at Rosboro.

# ARKANSAS PRIMARY HIGHWAY NETWORK

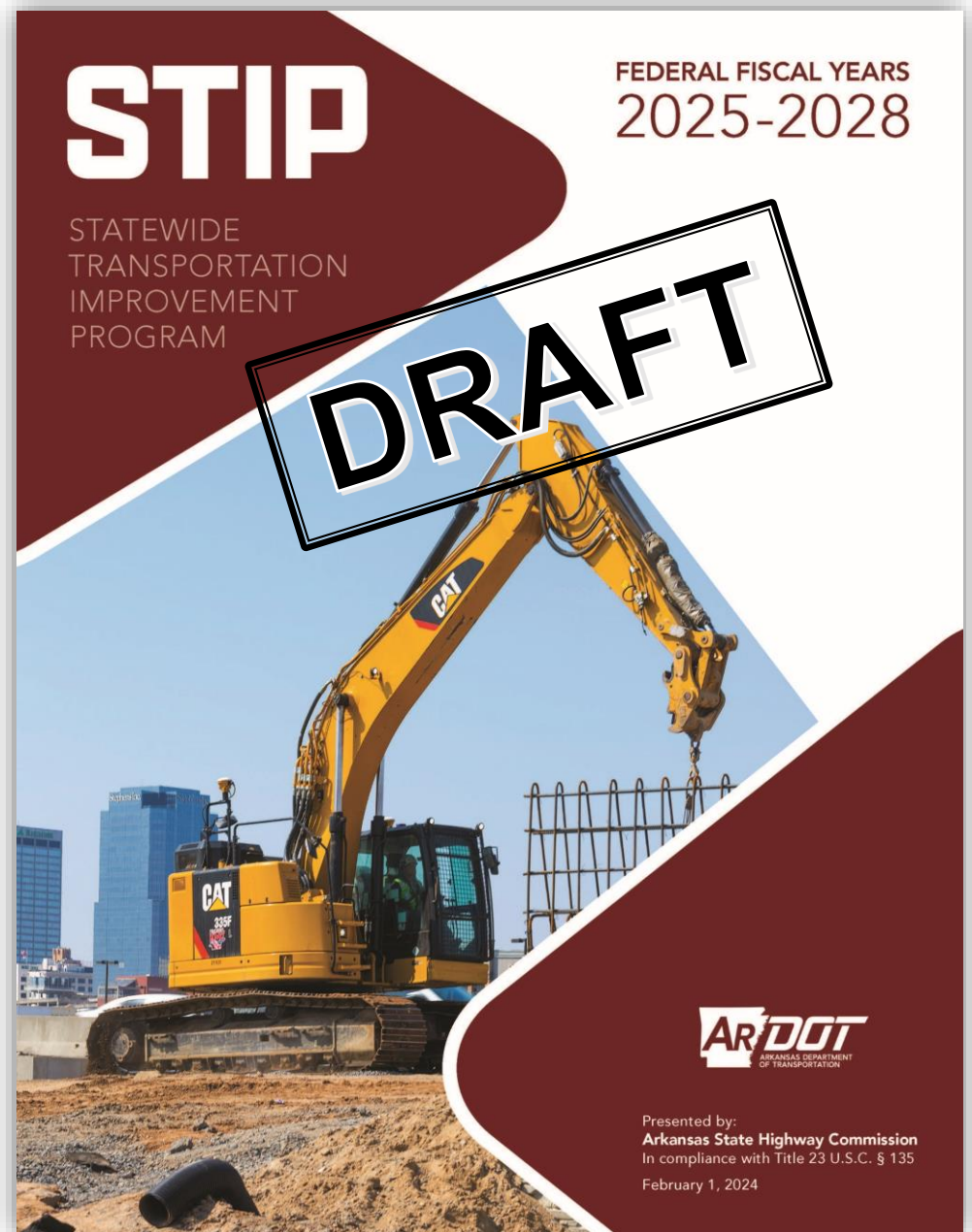

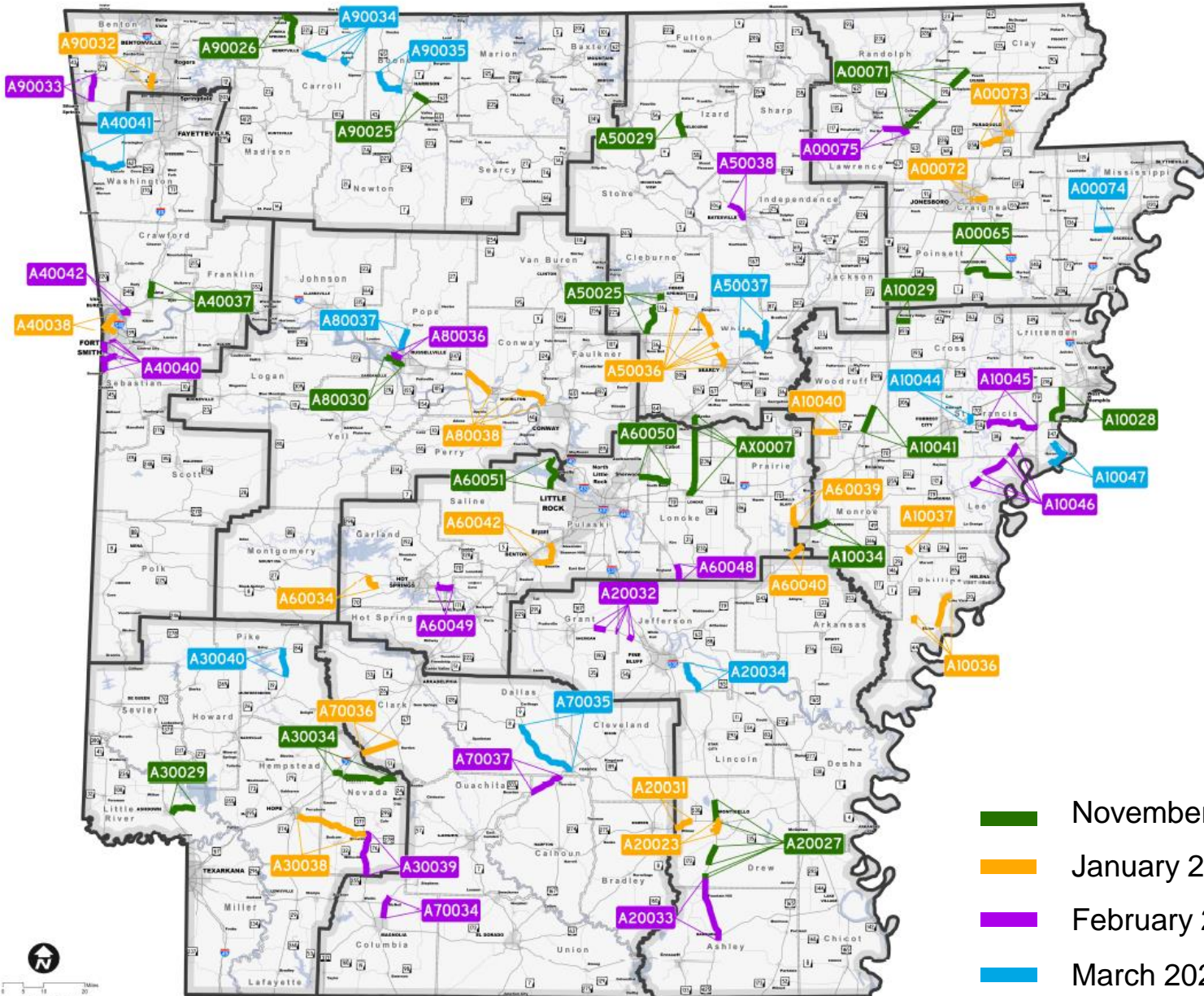

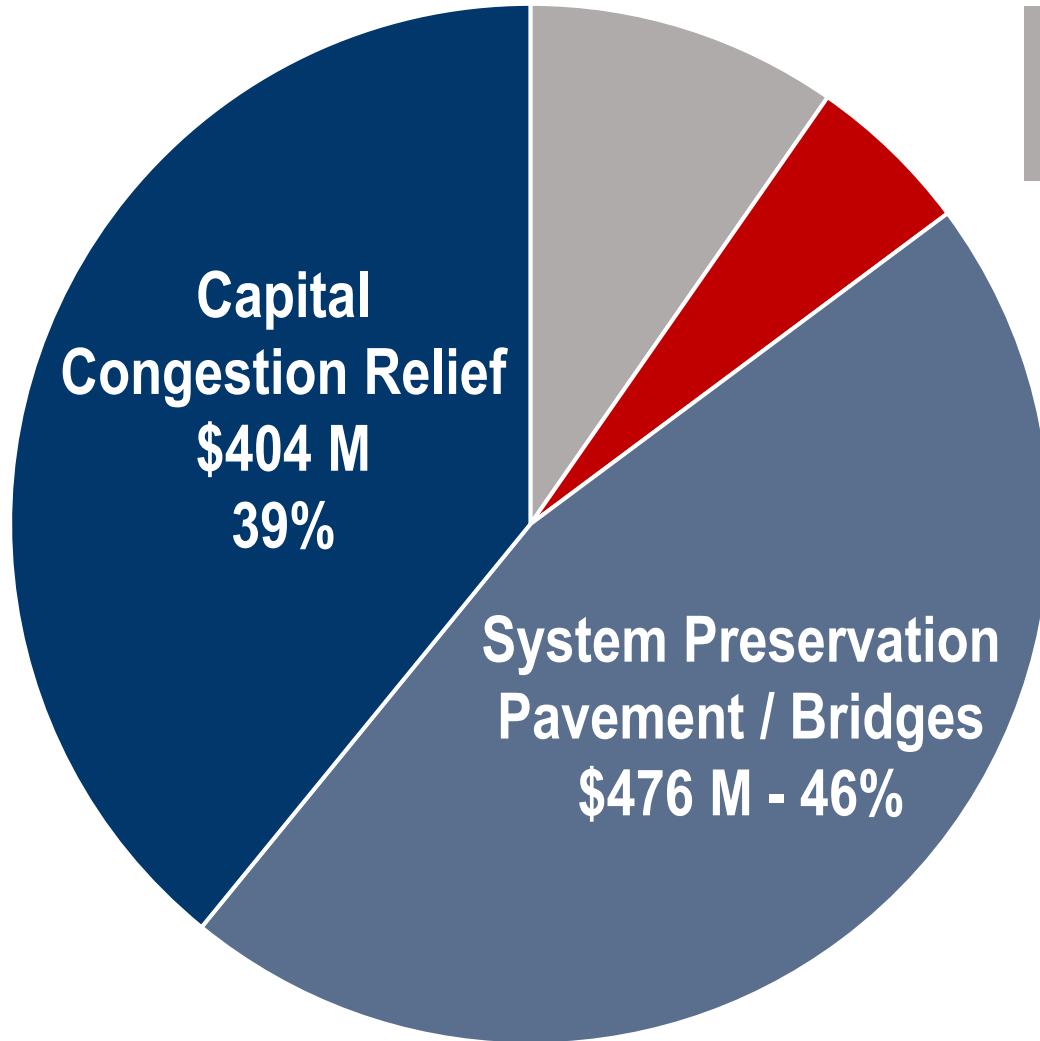
