

MINUTES OF THE MEETING

June 19, 2024

2024-023

IT IS ORDERED that a meeting of the Arkansas State Highway Commission be opened at 10:00 a.m., June 19, 2024.

2024-024

WHEREAS, the Purchasing Committee has awarded purchases on April 8, May 14, May 23, and June 4 in the amounts of \$2,827,022.20, \$299,110.00, \$1,495,925.00, and \$1,166,874.20, respectively, totaling \$5,788,931.40, and supply and service contracts, in accordance with authority previously conveyed, all of which have been documented by official minutes which are of record in the files of the Commission and Equipment and Procurement Division.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the action of the Purchasing Committee be ratified and confirmed in all particulars.

2024-025

WHEREAS, the Great Arkansas Cleanup is an important anti-litter program, which improves the scenic beauty of the State's highways; and

WHEREAS, the Arkansas Department of Transportation spends approximately \$5 million annually to remove litter from the State Highway System; and

WHEREAS, the Department's previous contributions to the Keep Arkansas Beautiful Foundation have been helpful in continuing the Great Arkansas Cleanup.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to make a contribution of \$40,000 this year to the Keep Arkansas Beautiful Foundation for use in conducting the Great Arkansas Cleanup Campaign.

2024-026

WHEREAS, the Arkansas Strategic Highway Safety Plan (SHSP) identifies younger drivers (24 years old or younger) as a focus area for improving highway safety; and

WHEREAS, from 2016 to 2020, 360 fatalities (13% of all traffic fatalities) and 2,394 serious injuries (18% of all serious injuries) in Arkansas involved younger drivers; and

WHEREAS, increasing risk awareness is a top strategy for improving the safety of younger drivers; and

WHEREAS, to support this strategy, the SHSP recommends targeting younger drivers, their parents, and others with media campaigns and outreach efforts about unsafe driving practices such as not wearing a seat belt, impaired driving, distracted driving, and speeding; and

WHEREAS, safety education and outreach are eligible for Federal-aid Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) funds.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to engage the services of a qualified consultant to develop, publish, and distribute educational materials about safe driving for Grades K through 12. This project will be conducted in partnership with the Arkansas Department of Education.

2024-027

WHEREAS, the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21) required that each state with a rail system(s) not regulated by the Federal Railroad Administration must meet the State Safety Oversight (SSO) Program requirements set forth by the Federal Transit Administration (FTA); and

WHEREAS, the Department was designated in 2013 by then Governor Mike Beebe to serve as the State Safety Oversight Agency (SSOA) for the State of Arkansas; and

WHEREAS, the SSOA is responsible for overseeing any rail fixed guideway public transportation system including the one currently operated by Rock Region Metro in Pulaski County; and

WHEREAS, the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) amended 49 U.S.C. § 5329, requiring State Safety Oversight Agencies to conduct risk-based inspections of the rail fixed guideway public transportation systems that the SSOA oversees; and

WHEREAS, FTA issued a Special Directive to the State of Arkansas requiring the development of policies and procedures for inspection access and data collection in consultation with each rail transit agency that the SSOA oversees; and

WHEREAS, the Department was certified by FTA on July 25, 2018 to comply with 49 CFR Part 674; and

WHEREAS, part of the certification required that the SSOA must be authorized to review, approve, oversee, investigate, inspect (including announced and unannounced access to infrastructure, equipment, records, personnel, and data for inspection purposes), and enforce safety requirements and a safety plan for the Rail Transit Agency; and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of the FTA certification, the Department's Chief Legal Counsel provided an opinion to FTA setting forth the manner by which this Commission is legally empowered to direct the Department to act on matters related to the safety oversight of public transportation, including all rail fixed guideway public transportation systems, such as the one operated by Rock Region Metro.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is hereby authorized to develop rules or policies setting forth the procedure to review, approve, oversee, investigate, inspect (including announced and unannounced access to infrastructure, equipment, records, personnel, and data for inspection purposes, including the data that the rail fixed guideway public transportation agency collects when identifying and evaluating safety risks), and enforce rail fixed guideway public transportation system safety plans, for the purpose of regulating and enforcing the requirements set forth in 49 U.S.C. § 5329.

2024-028

WHEREAS, the National Center for Asphalt Technologies (NCAT) facilitates high-value pavement research that addresses national needs using full-scale pavement testing facilities; and

WHEREAS, NCAT operates a test track to conduct research on experimental asphalt pavements; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Highway Administration has created a pooled fund study to provide a mechanism for state departments of transportation to participate in NCAT research; and

WHEREAS, participating in the pooled fund study would be beneficial to the Department by providing accelerated performance testing on innovative asphalt pavements; and

WHEREAS, the pooled fund study is eligible for Federal-aid State Planning and Research funds.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to participate in this pooled fund study and to enter into necessary agreements.

2024-029

WHEREAS, Minute Order 2021-057 authorized the Director to solicit proposals and enter into contracts with firms qualified to perform safety studies and engineering services for Federal Fiscal Years 2022 through 2024; and

WHEREAS, these on-call contracts have been found to be an effective method of supplementing in-house capabilities; and

WHEREAS, extending these on-call contracts for two additional years will ensure that the Department's needs for timely traffic safety studies and engineering services are met.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to proceed with extending the existing on-call contracts for safety studies and engineering services for two additional years, through Federal Fiscal Year 2026.

2024-030

WHEREAS, the Commission has authority to deliver projects using the Construction Manager-General Contractor (CM-GC), Progressive Design-Build (PDB), and Design-Build (DB) alternative delivery methods; and

WHEREAS, selection of the Contractors for alternative delivery projects is qualifications-based; and

WHEREAS, procuring the services of an Independent Cost Estimator by a qualified consulting firm is recommended to provide a contractor-style, production-based cost estimate and construction schedule to ensure the Department can negotiate effectively with the alternative delivery contractor and provide the best value to the Department.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to request proposals, select consulting firms, and enter into any necessary contracts and agreements with firms for on-call independent cost estimating services on projects for calendar years 2025 through 2030.

2024-031

WHEREAS, the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (Public Law 117-58) amended Title 23 U.S.C. 139 that includes specific conditions allowing the Department to use Federal-aid transportation funds for expenses related to work that streamlines the environmental process; and

WHEREAS, the Department has used Federal-aid funds since 2002 for liaison positions that expedite permitting and review processes and supplement staffing needs; and

WHEREAS, the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), through the Little Rock District, is responsible for issuing permits for highway construction, maintenance, and operation activities involving Waters of the United States pursuant to Sections 10 and 14 of the Rivers and Harbors Act and Section 404 of the Clean Water Act; and

WHEREAS, hundreds of projects are submitted to USACE for review and permitting annually by the Department; and

WHEREAS, Minute Order 2008-050 authorized the Department to enter into an agreement for the current USACE liaison position; and

WHEREAS, the current liaison position has proven beneficial to the Department and has streamlined the review and permitting process; and

WHEREAS, due to the increased number of Department projects and the need for expedited Section 408 reviews, an additional liaison position at the USACE is needed.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to enter necessary agreements with USACE to fund two positions to expedite Department projects.

2024-032

WHEREAS, it has been determined that improvements are warranted to enhance safety at the five railroad crossings indicated on the attached list; and

WHEREAS, these improvements are eligible for one hundred percent Federal-aid Rail-Highway Crossing Safety funds.

NOW THEREFORE, the Director is authorized to proceed with improvements at these crossings as funds become available subject to the following conditions:

- Maintenance of the signals and surfaces shall be performed by the applicable Railroad Company at no cost to the State.
- All required right-of-way shall be furnished at no cost to the State.

WHEREAS, the Arkansas State Highway Commission (Commission) acquired property known as Job No. 040376, Tract No. 116H, from Ethel Lucille Hall, by Warranty Deed with Control of Access dated May 22, 2003, and filed of record on June 2, 2003, as Document No. 7104997, in the Circuit Clerk's office for Sebastian County, Arkansas; and

WHEREAS, the Commission acquired Tract No. 116H for SIXTY-THREE THOUSAND AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$63,000.00) as right of way by the Commission and is not exempt from reacquisition by the former owners under Ark. Code Ann. § 27-67-322; and

WHEREAS, Marcus N. Booker and Amanda R. Booker, husband and wife, of Fort Smith, Arkansas have requested to purchase a portion of Job No. 040376, Tract No. 116H, identified as Tract No. 116HR, which the District Engineer for

District 4 has determined is not now, nor in the foreseeable future will be, needed for highway purposes; and

WHEREAS, Mr. and Mrs. Booker, husband and wife, offered to purchase the tract for ONE THOUSAND AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$1,000.00), representing the Fair Market Value as determined by three qualified appraisers; and

WHEREAS, the surplus tract identified as Tract No. 116HR is more particularly described as follows:

Part of the Northeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 25, Township 7 North, Range 32 West, Sebastian County, Arkansas, and being more particularly described as follows:

WHEREAS, the Arkansas State Highway Commission (Commission) acquired property known as Tract No. 21R, Job No. BB0411 from Helen Marie Srygley, A/K/A Angel Srygley Living Trust U/T/D, by Quitclaim Deed filed of record on November 16, 2022, in Book 2022, Page 37219, in the Circuit Clerk's office for Washington County, Arkansas; and

WHEREAS, this property is contiguous to State Highway 16 and is now necessary for Job No. BB0411 and which property the Commission now holds as a capital asset, being in Washington County, more fully described as:

Part of the Northeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 7, Township 16 North, Range 30 West, Washington County, Arkansas, more particularly described as follows:

WHEREAS, the Duane L. Sowell Revocable Trust dated July 26, 2012, of Little Rock, Arkansas has requested to purchase Job No. 061333, Tract No. 1R, which the District Engineer for District 6 has determined is not now, nor in the foreseeable future will be, needed for highway purposes; and

WHEREAS, Tract No. 1R was acquired as surplus property by the Commission and is exempt from reacquisition by the former owners under Ark. Code Ann. § 27-67-322. The Duane L. Sowell Revocable Trust, dated July 26, 2012, offered to purchase the tract for THREE HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$351,000.00). WHEREAS, the District Engineer for District 6 has determined that the areas proposed for release and transfer of the existing right of way are not now needed for highway purposes and recommends that these areas of the right of way be released and transferred to Saline County and revised by this Minute Order as more particularly described in Exhibit A attached hereto.

WHEREAS, Tract No. 9R1 was acquired as surplus by the Commission and is exempt from reacquisition by the former owners under Ark. Code Ann. § 27-67-322; and

WHEREAS, Trenton Edwards and Leah Edwards offered to purchase the tract for FOURTEEN THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$14,700.00), representing the Fair Market Value as determined as of January 29, 2024 by one qualified appraiser; and

WHEREAS, the Commission acquired Tract No. 9R1 for TWO THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$2,125.00), which Tract No. 9R1 is more particularly described as follows:

WHEREAS, Minute Order 2020-034 authorized a study to determine the need for and feasibility of future routes south and west of Jonesboro; and

WHEREAS, the Jonesboro South and West Connector Study has been prepared and has identified improvement alternatives within the study area.

NOW THEREFORE, this study is adopted for use as a planning guide for future improvements within the study area.

WHEREAS, Minute Order 2017-067 authorized a study to determine the need for and feasibility of a connection from Interstate 55 to Highway 61 south of Osceola; and

WHEREAS, the Osceola Industrial Access Connection Study has been prepared and has identified improvement alternatives within the study area.

NOW THEREFORE, this study is adopted for use as a planning guide for future improvements within the study area.

Chairman Farmer opened the meeting by welcoming those in attendance in-person, as well as those who were watching online.

MOTION Vice Chairman Philip Taldo moved, Commissioner Marie Holder seconded, and the motion passed to authorize the Department to make the Draft Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) for Federal Fiscal Years 2025 – 2028 available for public comment.

MOTION Vice Chairman Philip Taldo moved, Commissioner Marie Holder seconded, and the motion passed to approve the State Fiscal Year 2025 Operating Budget (July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025), as presented by Chief Fiscal Officer Patrick Patton, which included the following:

Salary Highlights

- 3% (\$8.3 million) Cost of Living Adjustment.
- 2% (\$5.6 million) Achieving Career Excellence (ACE) pay increases.
- Provide increases for career ladders.
- Increase minimum wage pay to \$15 an hour.

Operation Highlights

- 3% increase to Districts' Operating Budget.
- Increase in Statewide Maintenance and Information Technology Budgets.
- Increase in Mowing and Litter Pick-up Contracts and Capital Project commitments.

MOTION Commissioner Marie Holder moved, Vice Chairman Philp Taldo seconded, and the motion passed to enter into Executive Session at 11:27 a.m. to conduct an annual review of Director Lorie Tudor's employment.

MOTION Vice Chairman Philip Taldo moved, Commissioner Marie Holder seconded, and the motion passed to close Executive Session and reopen the public meeting at 12:40 p.m. Chairman Alec Farmer made brief remarks that the Commission was highly satisfied with Director Tudor's performance, giving her an exemplary evaluation. Director Tudor was granted a lump sum merit pay of two percent in addition to a three percent cost of living increase.

OTHER DISCUSSION ITEMS

McKenzie McMath Coronel, Executive Director of the Keep Arkansas Beautiful Commission (KAB), presented on the "2024 Great Arkansas Cleanup" and on the litter control activities of the KAB.

Patrick Patton, Chief Fiscal Officer, provided the May 2024 State Highway Revenue update. For State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2024 Budgeted vs. Actual Operating Expenses for ARDOT, overall expenses (maintenance, operations, administrative, and construction) were below budget by -9.9% (-\$16.8 million). Mr. Patton noted that State Highway Revenues to the Department from traditional sources for the year were up a total of 2.8% (\$18.2 million) in State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2024 compared to SFY 2023. Revenue from the Natural Gas Severance Tax was lower compared to the previous year. Total revenues available in SFY 2024 were -2.6% (-\$18.2 million) below last year. Actual State Revenue received was -4.7% (-\$33.0 million) below projected (budgeted) revenue for the year.

Kevin Thornton, Chief of Administration, updated the Commission on the 2024 Fiscal Session of the 94th General Assembly, which began on April 10 and concluded on May 9. Thornton reported that the Department's Appropriation bill for State Fiscal Year 2025 was passed and signed by the Governor. Thornton also reported that the Governor called a special session, beginning on June 17 to consider a tax reduction, 2025 appropriations for Arkansas Game and Fish, and other items, none of which would directly

impact the Department. Thornton updated the Commission on congressional committee positions which are currently held by the Arkansas delegation in relation to transportation.

Crystal Woods, Assistant Chief of Administration, provided an update on the Arkansas Legislative Council Efficiency Study Recommendations Rules for Implementation. The monthly reports for the May and June were submitted and addressed the following recommendations:

- Recommendation #1 noted that the Department should "Finalize Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) and implement performance management".
 - The KPI dashboard has been approved by the Oversight Committee and is posted to ARDOT's website.
 - Evaluation of all ARDOT data to develop additional KPIs and performance targets that will support the accomplishment of the Strategic Plan is underway.
 - A data survey for internal staff members has been developed.
- Recommendation #6 noted that the Department should "implement construction contractor performance measurement".
 - Seven projects have been selected for a pilot application of the draft manual which establishes how each metric will be used to evaluate prime contractors.
 - Several of the pilot projects are nearing completion and the committee members will soon be completing evaluation reports.

Woods also presented an overall update of the implementation of the recommendations. Within the 13 recommendations are 90 rules that will be completed. To date, the Department has completed 59 (66%) of these rules. Two recommendations have been fully implemented.

Keli Wylie, Assistant Chief Engineer – Program Delivery provided the bid letting update from the April 10 and May 22, 2024, bid lettings.

Rex Vines, Chief Engineer – Operations provided a maintenance activity update as well as an update to the Interstate 30 Default Recommendation. The contractor, Johnson Brothers Construction (JBC) continues to operate at a satisfactory level, with an estimated completion date in early December 2024. No action was taken on proceeding with the recommendation to default.

Director Tudor updated the Commission on recent Department activities. Since the April 4 meeting, several noteworthy Department activities occurred as listed below:

- Director Tudor gave the welcome at the Women in STEM Conference in Little Rock on April 12.
- Commissioner Holder, Director Tudor and many industry partners participated in a Workzone Awareness Week Kickoff in Little Rock on April 15.
- Chairman Farmer, Vice Chairman Taldo, Commissioner Holder, and Director Tudor attended the groundbreaking ceremony for the XNA Connector and Springdale Bypass on April 17.
- Director Tudor and Jared Wiley spoke at the Arkansas Asphalt Paving Association annual convention in Hot Springs on May 1.
- Chairman Farmer and Director Tudor attended a ribbon cutting ceremony for the completion of an overlay job on Highway 37 in Tuckerman on May 2.
- On May 21, Director Tudor provided the opening remarks for the annual Transportation Research Committee Transportation Conference and Expo in Hot Springs.
- Director Tudor spoke at the Batesville Community Enrichment Organization's monthly luncheon on May 22.
- Director Tudor spoke at the Pocahontas Rotary Club weekly luncheon on June 5.
- On June 12, Director Tudor presented to the Electrical League of Arkansas' monthly luncheon in Little Rock.
- Director Tudor presented to the Arkansas Transit Association Safety Management Council at their quarterly meeting in Rogers on June 13.

Jared Wiley, Chief Engineer – Preconstruction presented the Draft Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) for Federal Fiscal Years 2025-2028.

Director Tudor presented a list of upcoming meetings and events that the Director and Commission will be attending.


