GLOSSARY

ACHM – Asphalt Concrete Hot Mix

Bridge and Approaches - Constructing bridge structures and sections leading up to the bridge

Calendar day contract – Contract where the number of calendar days are bid

CAP – Connecting Arkansas Program

CPM -- Critical Path Method—A step-by-step project management technique that identifies critical activities that must be completed before the next stage can proceed.

(F) - Project with Federal Oversight

Grading and Structures - Earthwork and bridge construction; "structures" includes bridges and drainage structures

Interchange – Improvements to the junction between two or more roadways, typically including an overpass or bridge with associated ramps

IRP – Interstate Rehabilitation Program

Major Widening – Widening of an existing roadway to improve capacity or enhance safety, generally by adding a lane or lanes

New Location – Construction of a roadway on a location not previously developed for vehicular transportation

PCC Pavement – Portland Cement Concrete Pavement

Reconstruction – Generally, removing an existing roadway and building a new road in the same place

Rehabilitation – Modifying or improving an existing roadway; generally less costly and less time consuming than a full reconstruction

Resurfacing – Installation or application of a new driving surface; could be an overlay, sealing job, or similar procedure

ROW – Right of Way

(S) – Project with State Oversight

Safety and Traffic Engineering – Various improvements to enhance safety and/or improve traffic flow

Working Day Contract - Contract for which time will be assessed for each day on which conditions allow the Contractor to work per Standard Specification for Highway Construction 108.06

Increased project cost of \$629,000 is due to the need for additional quantities of traffic control devices, curb and gutter, drop inlets and pipe culverts, resurfacing/patching of the existing roadway, and the need to remove and replace unsuitable soil at various locations including beneath a retaining wall. (The project cost increase previously showed \$1.7 million due to not excluding lane use charges that were deducted incorrectly and have since been corrected.)

The Contractor is currently placing concrete pavement on the eastbound lanes east of the Saline River. Structural work includes the eastbound Saline River bridge, eastbound Saline River Relief bridge and eastbound Hwy. 67 bridge. Pending plans are to complete the roundabout/South Street area and ramps.

The purpose of this project is to reconstruct & widen I-30 from I-530 to I-40 and I-40 from Pike Avenue to Hwy. 67/167 & the replacement of the Arkansas River Bridge in Pulaski County.



This project is also referred to as the 30 Crossing Project. It is the Department's first Design-Build Project.

The project's overall cost has increased by approximately \$93 million due to the following: \$37.3 million to add the demolition, design, and reconstruction of the 9th Street overpass of I-30, including associated retaining wall work along I-30; \$55.4 million to add an entrance ramp linking the southbound frontage road to I-630 westbound.

I-30 traffic was placed on the new eastbound Arkansas River Bridge in September 2022. Demolition of the existing I-30 Arkansas River Bridge began September 19, 2022 and is scheduled to be complete July 2023. Construction of the substructure/foundations of the westbound I-30 Arkansas River Bridge began in November 2022. 9th Street Bridge over I-30 in Little Rock scheduled to open to traffic in April 2023.



The current Contract amount has increased by approximately \$645,000. This overrun is due to the addition of special clearing 30' from the edge of both outside shoulders and a plan error that will overrun the pay item construction pavement markings.





Utility relocations have been completed with the Contractor restarting work in September 2022. According to the latest project schedule, the utility delays have pushed completion of the project into Late 2024.

Change orders amounting to approximately \$985k have been processed to add signs, temporary drainage, adjustments to a pedestrian trail (94k), shoulder strengthening for maintenance of traffic (\$346k), subgrade stability (96k), revision of drainage to avoid utilities (\$78k), additional removal and disposal of various items, and to award delay costs to the Contractor related to utility delays (\$360k).

Work on the project was significantly delayed due to utility conflicts that have affected the entire project. Utility relocations have been completed.

Separately, during the course of the delay, the Department provided the Contractor an opportunity to add paving work to the Contract that was originally expected to be completed in a separate project (04X048). This was accomplished by change order and processed on March 18, 2022.

The project cost has increased by approximately \$2.76 million, primarily due to three items: 1) inclusion of a reinforced concrete box culvert, 2) paving that was originally slated to be accomplished under another contract (04X048), and 3) an additional 1/2 mile section of paving near the District HQ to tie in adjacent jobs/work.

The Contractor recently sent in a request to cancel the Contract citing a nearly two-year delay related to utility conflicts. The Contractor claimed that over the last approximately two years there have been dramatic increases in job costs due to inflation. These cost increases have impacted labor, equipment, materials, and hauling components of the work--far exceeding the risk the Contractor anticipated during their bid process. A change order to compensate the Contractor for these costs is pending. Since the utility conflicts are no longer an issue, the Contractor is able to once again pursue work on the project.
