NONDESTRUCTIVE TESTING (NDT) OF CONCRETE BRIDGE DECKS**

Notice is hereby given that the Arkansas Department of Transportation (Department) is seeking letters of interest from entities with extensive experience providing consulting and testing services as well as equipment and monitoring for nondestructive testing of concrete bridge decks to evaluate structures for deficiencies.

The scope of work will consist of recommendation and performance of nondestructive testing technologies and methods of concrete bridge decks and providing reports for:

- Deficiency Location/Size/Depth
 - Delamination
 - Spalls
 - Cracking
- Concrete Voids
- Integrity
- Stiffness (Dynamic Modulus)
- Rebar Cover
- Corrosion probability and potential
- Dimensions (Thickness/Size of Member)
